



LEEDS DERMATOLOGIST PHIL LAWS TAKES ON RIDE 100 TO RAISE MONEY FOR SKIN DISEASE RESEARCH

Meanwood-based Consultant Dermatologist, Phil Laws is taking on the Ride 100 London to Surrey challenge to raise money for skin disease research. The 38 year old will take on the 100 mile cycling challenge on Sunday 2nd August, starting at London's Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, riding through the capital into Surrey's stunning countryside.
